**Course content:** This course serves as an introduction to calculus, and will cover limits, derivatives, and some applications of differentiation.

**Grading:** There are four main components of your grade: Homework (20%), two midterm exams (25% each), and a final exam (30%).

**Homework:** Homework will be assigned weekly, on Mondays, and will be due on the Wednesday of the following week, in class. Exceptions will be noted in class and in an email. Each week, there will be both practice problems and graded problems. The practice problems will not be graded, but you will not succeed in class without doing them. Moreover, exams may draw upon the practice problems.

**Exams:** There will be two midterm exams and the final exam. You are required to take the exams at the scheduled date and time. If for some reason this does not work for you, please let me know at least a week in advance. If you are unable to take an exam at the scheduled time due to medical reasons, accommodations will be made only with a note from a doctor. Please note: **Travel plans are not an acceptable reason to miss an exam!**

- *Midterm 1:* The first midterm exam will be **Friday, January 30** at 9 AM, in class.
- *Midterm 2:* The second midterm exam will be **Friday, February 20** at 9 AM, in class.
- *Final:* The final exam will be on **Monday, March 16th** from 7:00 to 10:00 PM.
